Real Question 2, Part 4: God Speaks Scripture Handout

Gospel of Luke, Chapter 8, Verses 43-48

Introduction: Jesus had sailed across the lake from the area where the Gerasene people lived, and was back in Galilee, where he was welcomed by a crowd. A man named Jairus, a leader from the Synagogue, came and begged Jesus to come to his house – his daughter was dying. This is the story of what happened on the way.

The crowds were almost stifling Jesus as he went. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from a haemorrhage for twelve years, whom no-one had been able to cure. She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak; and the haemorrhage stopped at that instant. Jesus said, "Who touched me?" When they all denied that they had, Peter and his companions said, "Master, it is the crowds round you, pushing." But Jesus said, "Someone touched me. I felt that the power had gone out from me." Seeing herself discovered, the woman came forward trembling, and falling at his feet explained in front of all the people why she had touched him and how she had been cured at that very moment. "My daughter," he said, "your faith has restored you to health; go in peace."
